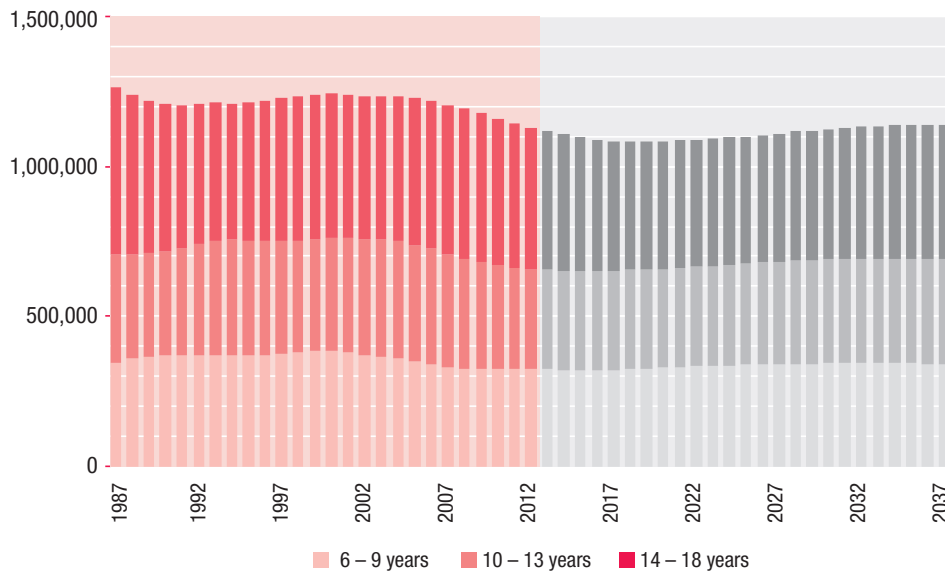

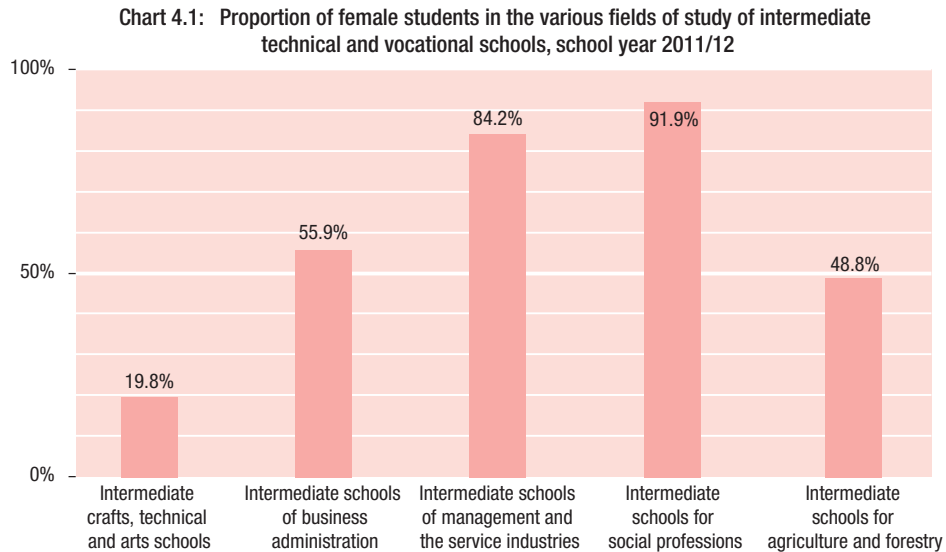
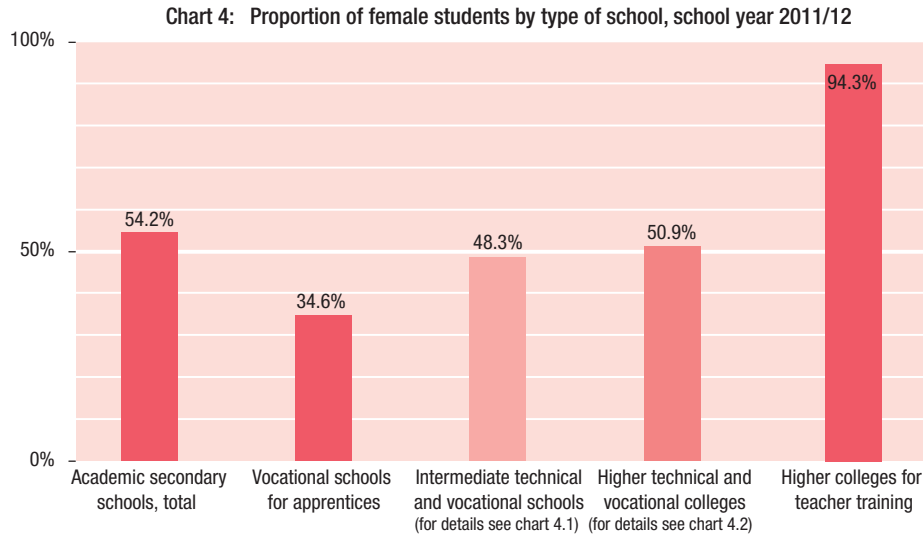


Chart 4.2: Proportion of female students in the various fields of study of higher technical and vocational colleges, school year 2011/12

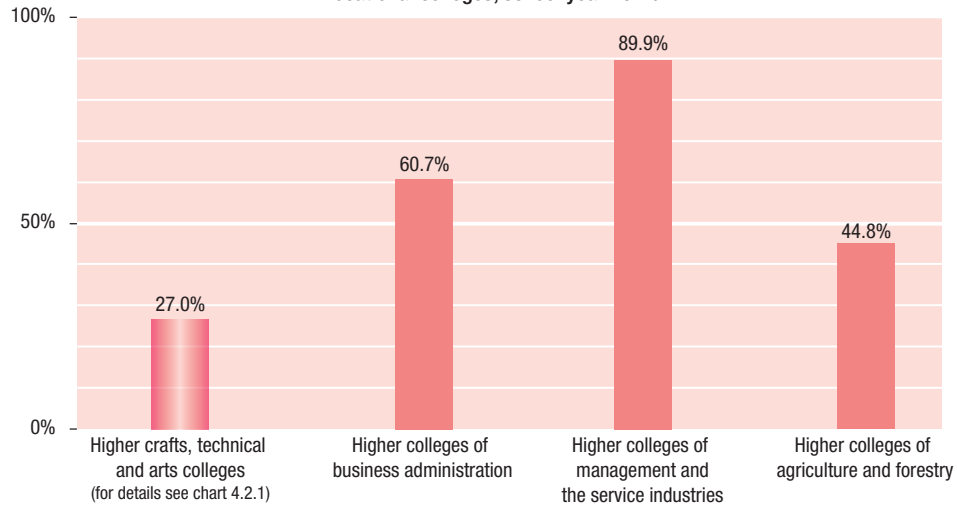


Chart 4.2.1: Proportion of female students in the higher crafts, technical and arts colleges school year 2011/12

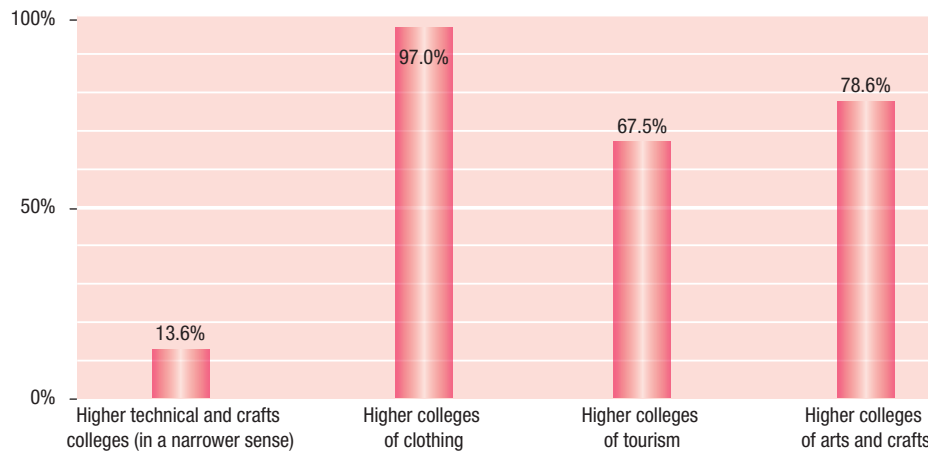

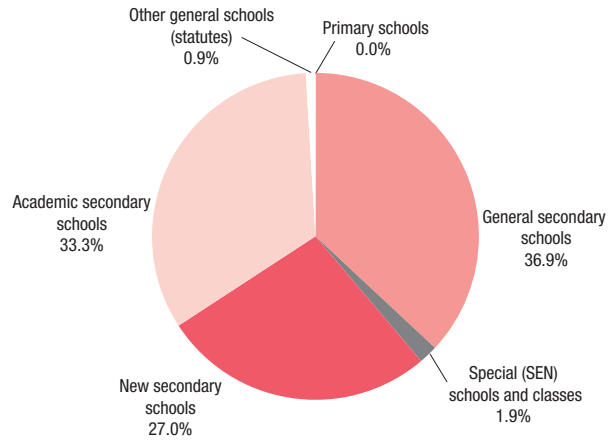

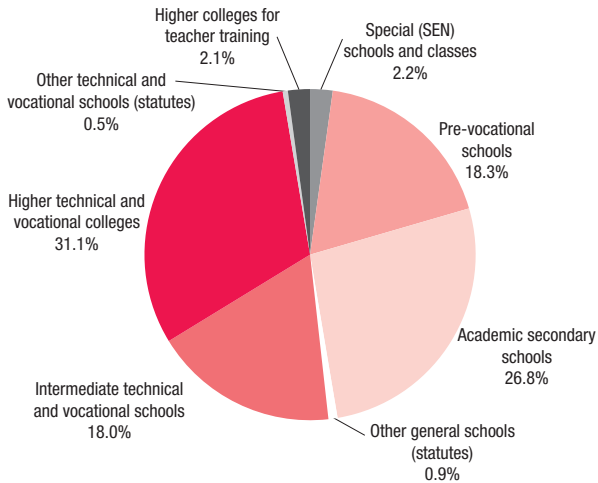

school year 2011/12

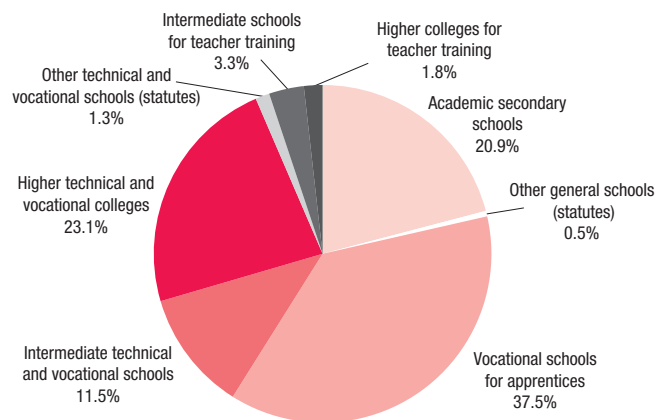

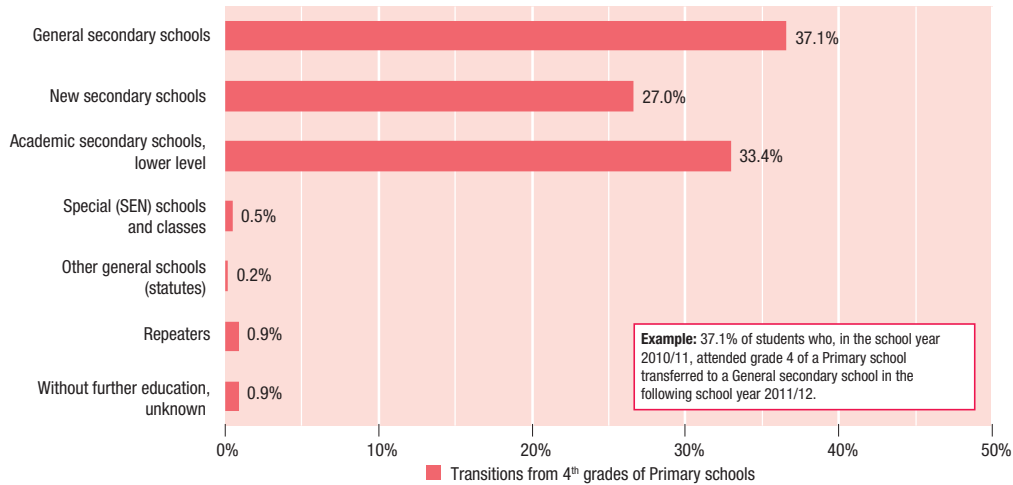

Transitions from 4th grades of General secondary schools and Academic secondary schools, lower level, school year 2011/12

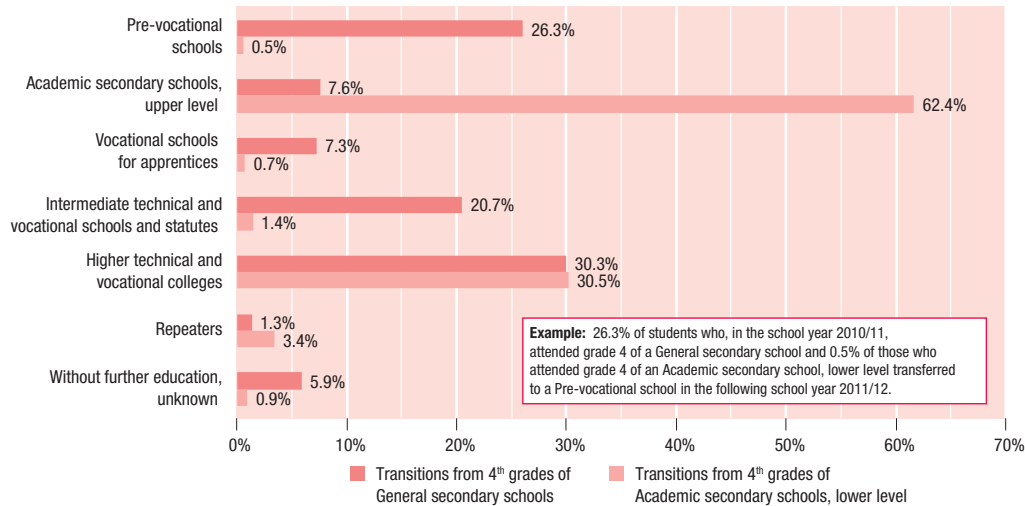
