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## Preface

Fact-based policies are of crucial importance at the national and international levels. Therefore, the Federal Ministry for Education, the Arts and Culture publishes statistical key data on the educational system with the aim to provide a compact, readable and solid foundation for fact-based policy.

In the future, the "Statistical Guide" series so far published jointly with the Science Department will be continued and further developed by the Ministry for Education under the title "Statistical Guide 2007 - key facts and figures about schools and adult education in Austria". The well known tables presenting data on schools, classes, pupils and students, teachers and the proportions of school types are kept in a similar style for the purpose of comparison. Context tables are added on demographic development, educational attain-
 ment of the resident population, on participation in foreign language classes, on the distribution of class sizes in the various types of school as well as on participation in different opportunities of adult education. A new graphic representation of the Austrian educational system together with thematic figures and diagrams are to provide a quick glance on selected topics.

In order to provide a fast statistical overview on education in Austria to an international audience this booklet is published for the first time in a bilingual version (German and English).
